The June 2022 meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners of Buena Vista Township Fire District No. 1 at the Richland Fire House was called to order at 7:30 PM by Chairman Andrew J. Levari III. A motion was made by Duke Levari and seconded by Mary Ann Micheletti to pay all bills. Roll Call: L. Burshtin - Yes, M. Burshtin - Yes, Levari, Jr. - Yes, Levari III - Yes, Micheletti - Yes. Motion was approved.

<u>Old Business:</u> Secretary Michael Burshtin reported that the Richland Volunteer Fire Company has updated the member qualification requirements in its Bylaws as recommended by our solicitor Richard Braslow. The suspended Fire Company member has moved out of the service area, and are awaiting a letter of resignation. New door key fobs and ID numbers have been assigned to all Fire Company members. Tanker 12-19 master pressure gauge was reported to be sticking, and a replacement has been ordered. A larger SDS binder has been ordered.

<u>New Business:</u> Assistant Fire Chief Anthony Mazzio presented several cost estimates from T-Mobile for electronic NFIRS fire incident reporting, basically by using internet-connected devices in each truck. Proposals for both tablet devices and iPad devices were reviewed, and all Commissioners were in agreement to use the tablet concept due to its significant cost savings. Cases and holders would be used to protect the devices. The following resolution was then offered:

<u>Resolution 2022-14</u>: (Tablets) - A motion was made by Lynn Burshtin and seconded by Mary Ann Micheletti to use T-Mobile tablets, and not iPads, for electronic NFIRS reporting, due to its significant cost savings. Roll Call: L. Burshtin - Yes, M. Burshtin - Yes, Levari, Jr. - Yes, Levari III - Yes, Micheletti - Yes. Motion was approved.

The Secretary announced that the NJ Department of Community Affairs had just announced a 2022 American Rescue Plan Firefighter Grant program, for grants up to \$75,000 for Covid-related equipment, with applications due August 13. He was able to obtain verification from DCA that SCBA equipment was included. The Commissioners were in agreement to apply for the maximum amount of \$75,000 for replacement 4500 psi SCBA equipment which will need to be obtained in the next two years.

<u>Resolution 2022-15</u>: (American Rescue Plan Firefighter Grant) - A motion was made by Duke Levari and seconded by Mary Ann Micheletti to authorize the Fire District to submit to the NJ Department of Community Affairs an American Rescue Plan Firefighter Grant application for \$75,000 for acquisition of replacement SCBA apparatus, and that the Chairman and Secretary are authorized to execute all required documents. Roll Call: L. Burshtin - Yes, M. Burshtin - Yes, Levari, Jr. - Yes, Levari III - Yes, Micheletti - Yes. Motion was approved.

The Commissioners were in agreement that the Richland Volunteer Fire Company was responsible for the direct oversight and supervision of its Fire Company members via its Bylaws and Rules.
